

## Most Popular Career Advising session Topics

Prior to their appointment, most students reported felling confused or overwhelmed and confident or informed following their appointment.

The Center's exit survey had 20% response rate. 99% of students reported having their needs met, and when asked if they would recommend Pomerantz Career Center to a friend, a majority of responses were positive, resulting in an 84% Net Promoter Score.

## **ENABLING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

Internships are essential for launching a strong career—those who participate in them are more likely to have positive post-graduate outcomes. However, the lack of pay at non-profit or government internships can be a barrier to participation for students with high financial need.

That's where the Hawkeye Internship Grant comes in. In summer 2020, three students received \$1,000 each to support their living expenses while doing an unpaid internship at a non-profit or in government. "I decided to pursue social work because of my interest in empowering individuals with mental illness and advocating for equitable access to quality mental health care. The knowledge I learned in my social work courses at the University of Iowa, including about the person-

in-environment perspective, cultural humility, trauma, abuse, mental illness, human behavior, and motivational interviewing all helped me to prepare for the work I do at the NAMI-Johnson County. The scholarship helped me worry less about the financial cost of my unpaid internship and more about the learning opportunities and growth I could get out of my internship. The scholarship helped me out tremendously."

Being able to communicate my work to a broad range of audiences is crucial to making my work effective in the future."

# ACADEMIC & LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

The Pomerantz Career Center provides 22 courses about a variety of topics, including leadership, communication, careers and teamwork. Offered through the departments of Leadership Studies or Career Center Programs, the courses connect students with industry professionals, who share their knowledge about career paths, networking and other topics. The Center also advises the Certificate in Leadership Studies, a 20/21-hour interdisciplinary leadership certificate program.

#### Fall 2019 – Summer 2020 Academic Courses Highlights

- In 2019-20, taught 22 different courses with 100 sections, enrolling 3,527 students
- · Course formats included in-person, hybrid, online, full-semester, and off-cycle
- Many CCP and LS courses count toward UI programs of study
- Certificate in Leadership Studies was among the top 3 most popular certificates earned by the class of 2020! (stories.uiowa.edu/celebrating-university-iowa-spring-2020-graduates)
- COVID-19 sections of CCP courses added 600 seats to meet need on extremely short notice! We
  were additionally prepared to open 800 more seats if needed.

# THE CERTIFICATE IN LEADERSHIP STUDIES

**59** graduated or were conferred the Certificate in Leadership Studies during Fall 2019-Summer 2020.

**179** students declared their pursuit of the Certificate in Leadership Studies as of Fall 2019





Through the courses in Career Leadership Academy (CLA), students interact with employers and learn how communication, analysis, teamwork, and other skills apply to careers as they apply for jobs and graduate programs.

**574** students participated in CLA. They represent all four years and more than 50 majors, with Enterprise Leadership (35%) as the largest major.

106 employers participated in CLA classes and events resulting in over 200 engagements with students throughout the year.


## THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA POST-GRADUATION DATA
