Teach English Abroad: Resources and Tips

With teaching English abroad resources, students are advised to seek out reviews of the program online/via message boards, and to request that the program connect them with a couple of past teachers who have since finished the program and returned to the U.S. Dave's ESL Café is perhaps the biggest and the oldest site listing opportunities, but any program can post and isn't necessarily vetted or approved. Certain countries have their own programs, such as JET in Japan, Talk in South Korea, and language assistants in France and Spain, which are all well-known and generally well-regarded.

Students should also carefully evaluate their options for ESL or TESOL or TESL certification. An online certification, inperson workshop/short duration boot camp, and actual (lengthy) teacher ed. certification are all viewed differently. Generally, higher quality and more rigorous teach abroad opportunities will require higher quality, more rigorous certification.

Consult Going Global (inside HireaHawk) and Kiss, Bow, Shake Hands (via UI Library databases) to review cultural advice and also work visa information for many countries worldwide.

General advice to students considering teaching abroad, especially without any kind of certification—read any contract thoroughly. Google the name of the program/employer + reviews or + scam. Ask for references you can contact who are former teachers with the program/employer.
