

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Career Leadership Academy (CLA)

Through the courses in this academy, students interact with employers and learn how communication, analysis, teamwork, and other skills apply to careers as they apply for jobs and graduate programs. In 2018-2019, the curriculum included new activities, such as a Career Prep Night, Kaleidoscope Leadership Conference and Hybrid Courses.
